I wanted to write to thank you, your teachers, pupils and parents for participating in the **#UniteTheUniforms for the @999Cenotaph** campaign on Friday 3rd December 2021, and for the generous donation we received.

It was so incredibly heart-warming to see the many photographs of pupils wearing the colours of the emergency services and dressed up as NHS and 999 workers.

My colleagues and I are very pleased to be able to send you a certificate of gratitude as a small token of our thanks. We are compiling a book of donors and I am pleased to confirm that the name of your school will be included as a key supporter in helping to make the UK's Emergency Services Cenotaph a reality.

As I advised in my letter inviting schools to participate, the 999 Cenotaph will honour everybody who has ever served in the NHS and emergency services – from call handlers, admin staff and porters to first responders, nurses and GPs. Those on the frontline could not do their jobs without people working hard behind the scenes.

Almost **2 million** people work and volunteer across the NHS and emergency services today, including 250,000 first responders.

Each and every one of us has been helped by the NHS or emergency services at some point in our lives. Whether it's from seeing your GP, firefighter's putting out a fire or police officers coming to your aid. We all take those who serve in the NHS and emergency services for granted. We know that when we need help, it will arrive.

It is our hope that the 999 Cenotaph – the national symbol of gratitude, sacrifice and remembrance – will be located on Whitehall, London. The Sculptor advises me the monument could stand for up to 1,000 years.

Thank you again for playing a part in this once in a lifetime monument to our NHS and 999 heroes, and thank you for the invaluable work you are doing to educate the pupils of today and the NHS and emergency services of tomorrow.
